From the Board of Directors

In 2018, the Inner Sunset Merchants Association (ISMA) benefitted greatly from renewed volunteer participation. With a full board, ISMA focused on improving operations, communications and strengthening relationships with key constituents. Efforts were made to expand business memberships to be included in the upcoming Neighborhood Guide - ISMA's primary marketing piece designed to increase awareness and visitor traffic.

In previous years, ISMA concentrated on the possibility of creating a Community Benefit District or Green Benefit District for the Inner Sunset. These initiatives can be found in fellow San Francisco neighborhoods which work to improve the overall quality of life through partnerships between the City and its local communities. Due to a variety of obstacles, these efforts did not materialize.

After much board discussion, ISMA decided to re-direct its focus on re-building membership, engaging merchants and supporting activities believed to be generally beneficial to the Inner Sunset community. With the upcoming completion of the Inner Sunset Streetscape Project

construction, we believe this is the perfect time to highlight the Inner Sunset business district, nurturing its growth and showcasing why it is one of San Francisco's premier locations to shop, dine, live and work.

Merchant memberships and strong community engagement have remained the cornerstones of ISMA since its founding over 90 years ago. Our sincere thanks and appreciation to current/past/soon-to-be merchant members, our local institutions and the dedicated residential community that make the Inner Sunset such a thriving, enduring San Francisco destination.

- Launched a new ISMA website on an easier-to-maintain platform, enhancing communications and adding value for merchant members
- Increased communication through periodic newsletters and increased engagement on ISMA Instagram page (@innersunsetmerchants)
- Produced and printed Shop-Dine-Explore neighborhood map and member postcard guide, which was distributed from member businesses, California Academy of Sciences and University of California, San Francisco (UCSF)

 UCSF Parnassus Heights Re-Envisioning Process: UCSF continues to identify potential improvements that would further neighborhood goals for the physical environment in the areas

- surrounding its campus. ISMA board member, Craig Dawson, represented merchant and ISMA interests on the working group.
- Inner Sunset Park Neighbors: ISPN works to engage all who live, work or play in the Inner Sunset and provide infrastructure and support to improve quality of life, build community and generate pride in the neighborhood. ISMA maintained communication and a spirit of collaboration with ISPN. ISMA board members, Craig Dawson and Angie Petitt-Taylor, served as liaisons.

Initiatives

- DPW/MTA Construction (Underway): Facilitated ongoing communication between merchants and SF Public Works regarding Inner Sunset Streetscape Project construction.
- 9th Avenue & Lincoln Way Improvement Project (Planning Phase): A city-led effort to improve the connection between the Inner Sunset neighborhood and Golden Gate Park.
 Plans include increased safety, visibility, wayfinding, and streetscape improvements to the entry, and the stretch of 9th Avenue from Lincoln Way to Irving Street. In collaboration with key merchants and interested neighbors, ISMA presented SFDPW and District 5 Supervisor Vallie Brown with over 60 local merchant letters of support for the project.

- September 25 Mayor Breed Business Reception An evening hosted by the SF Chamber of Commerce for local businesses to meet the Mayor and hear more about her vision



- February 7 A Certificate of Honor was presented to ISMA by the Board of Supervisors City & County of San Francisco recognizing outstanding service to the people of San Francisco
- May 19- SF Small Business Week Shop Dine in the 49: As a result of SFCDMA's leadership, fees for sidewalk sales were waived for all member merchant corridors, including Inner Sunset
- September 17 ISMA Member Gathering hosted by member Shin Dig, featured presentations by Supervisor Vallie Brown; Executive Director of San Francisco Office of Small Business, Regina Dick-Endrizzi; and Mike Rieger, SF Public Works. ISMA member, Donna O'Leary, owner of Ambiance stores, presented merchant letters of support for the 9th Avenue & Lincoln Way Project.
- November 13 Airbnb Inner Sunset Merchant Walk: Through a collaboration between SFCDMA and Airbnb, the Inner Sunset hosted Airbnb Super-Hosts as they rediscovered the varied businesses of this corridor, allowing them to provide recommendations to future Airbnb guests.
- November 24 -Small Business Saturday: As a neighborhood champion, ISMA offered marketing resources, such as signs, bags and balloons, to members for Small Business Saturday, a nationwide initiative
- December 9 Co-hosted ISMA/ISPN "Taste of the Inner Sunset" Holiday Party at the County Fair Building which drew approximately 300 neighbors to attend and guest presentations by Mayor London Breed and District 5 Supervisor Vallie Brown. Many local restaurants and businesses donated food, beverages and raffle prizes.


